When people ask "what does Advent mean?", you'll probably hear a classicist somewhere whipping out the explanation that "advent" derives from the Latin "advenio" meaning: I arrive, come. But does that really answer the question? I'm not so sure.

For Christians, Advent is not merely the arrival of Jesus, but the waiting for that time. It is the start of the Christian calendar. It means a lot of purple, and prayer, and the fancy term "penitential" season. But mainly it's about the waiting.

One of the best books I have ever read on this was Paula Gooder's *The Meaning is in the Waiting.* Somehow she made it make sense to me more than anyone ever had before. But I think that although there is a deep theological root in the concept of Advent, it's not something that should be solely that. Advent is a time that we can all participate in, no matter what faith, or none, we have, and no matter where or who we are.

Because we're all waiting. Waiting for deadlines to be over. Waiting for the holidays to come. Waiting to see family and friends again. Waiting for whatever Christmas means to us. And when we're waiting, there's a weight of expectation. How we cope with, and reflect on that, is the meaning of Advent to me. To me, it's the reflection that the season of Advent brings that is important. With so much expectation, it's a chance to take some time out and think about what is important, to think on what we could improve, and what we're thankful for. Whether we celebrate Thanksgiving, a Christian New Year, Christmas or any other kind of festival, this is a season of thanks, reflection and hope. We can all buy into that, even just for 5 minutes every morning. It doesn't require Christmas music, or chocolate calendars, or carols and mulled wine, although these may well help. It requires a bit of mental space, a bit of quiet, and just a little bit of solitude to think.


